


Degree Apprenticeships

What are the advantages?

- Study for a degree whilst working (no debt and get paid)
- Gain work experience whilst studying
- More relevance to what you're studying

Things to consider

You need a fairly clear idea of what you want to do

You need to be ready to enter the adult working environment - not the 'uni' experience

They are very competitive but more opportunities each year

Applications are direct to the employer – can be time consuming

The recruitment process can be very rigorous
