Direct Entry Students

The Basics

- Each student will receive a 'Welcome Pack'
- Personal edofe account
- Must attend all dates
- Regular drop in computer sessions will be run to help progress
- Meetings with DofE Staff will be held to facilitate completion
- On completion receive a certificate and badge
(for Gold invited to St. James's Palace for presentation)

Insurance

- Covered by the school's travel insurance – full details on the *Parent Portal*.
- We will not make claims for items such as laptops, PDAs, smartphones and cameras and other expensive personal possessions under the travel insurance as we wish to maintain our claim record.
- The school recommends that pupils do not take items of value
- Note that this is classed by the insurance company as a course rather than a trip so the amount of any claim for medical reasons will be very limited. A claim cannot be made for any element of the scheme already completed and can only relate to transport.
- Pre-existing medical conditions are covered provided that the travel is not against doctor's orders. We recommend that, if a pupil does has a pre-existing condition which a parent may be worried about, that they seek their doctor's permission to travel (preferably in writing).
