






The Fox Girl and the White Gazelle – Victoria Williamson ISBN: 9781782504900





Set in Glasgow, twelve-year-old refugee Reema is struggling to find her place in a new country, with a new language and without her brother. Her Glaswegian neighbour Caylin is lonely and lashing out. When they discover an injured fox and her cubs hiding on their estate, the girls form a wary friendship. They are more alike than they could have imagined: they both love to run. Reema and Caylin find friendship, freedom and the discovery that home isn't a place, it's the people you love. Heartfelt and full of hope, *The Fox Girl and the White Gazelle* is an uplifting story about the power of friendship and belonging.

As hope of rescue begins to fade, they find strength in these tales of magic, heroes, thieves, greedy sultans, and brave girls. When they land on a desert island, they meet a stranger who is not what he seems... and when they head back out on the waves once more, a shadow follows...






The Hunger Games prequel.
