

Easter Holiday Homework Expectations 2021

Years 7, 8, 9

1. No formal homework will be set for the holiday (although some pupils may have to complete homework set for the last week of the term).
2. Pupils will be expected to catch up on any missed or incomplete work and sort any files or folders.

Year 10

Based on a minimum of 2 hours work per week day.

1. Homework may be set for certain subjects.
2. Pupils will be expected to catch up on any missed or incomplete work and sort any files or folders.
3. Begin a revision programme for a Maths assessment beginning Monday 24 May 2021. Other subjects may be having in class tests around a similar date. Individual teachers will give information about these tests.

Year 11

Based on a minimum of 4 hours work per week day.

1. Specific holiday work/revision will be set for many subjects.
2. Pupils should continue to follow their revision timetables using revision materials given to them by their teachers. Pupils should be encouraged to use a variety of revision techniques (revision books, online resources, past papers).
3. FIAs will run from 28 April until 20 May 2021.

Sixth Form

Upper Sixth based on a minimum of 5 hours work per weekday.

1. Specific holiday work may be set for certain subjects.
2. Students will be expected to catch up on any missed or incomplete work and sort any files or folders.
3. Students should continue to follow their revision timetables using revision materials given to them by their teachers. Students should be encouraged to use a variety of revision techniques (revision books, online resources, past papers).
4. FIAs for Upper Sixth will run from 5 May until 20 May 2021.

Lower Sixth based on a minimum of 4 hours work per weekday.

1. Specific holiday work may be set for certain subjects.
2. Students will be expected to catch up on any missed or incomplete work and sort any files or folders.
3. Lower Sixth will have end of year exams week commencing 24 May 2021 for all subjects. Students should be revising and preparing for these exams.
