



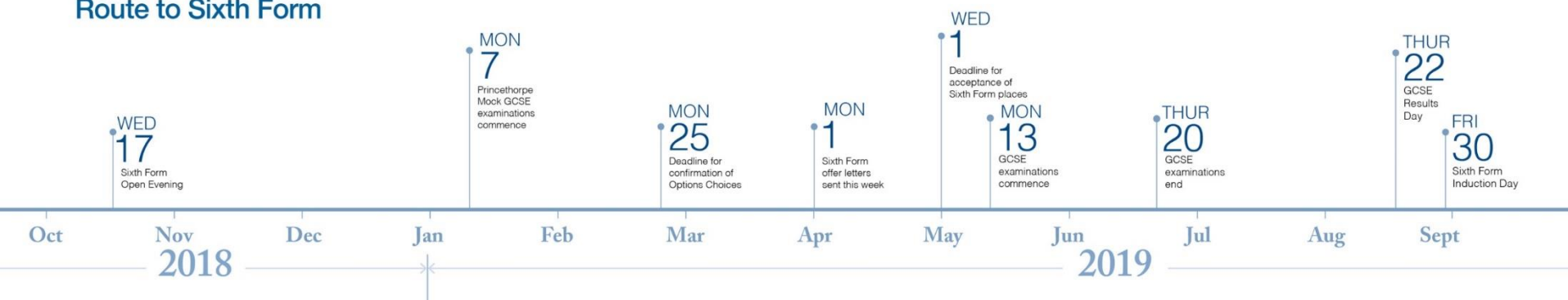

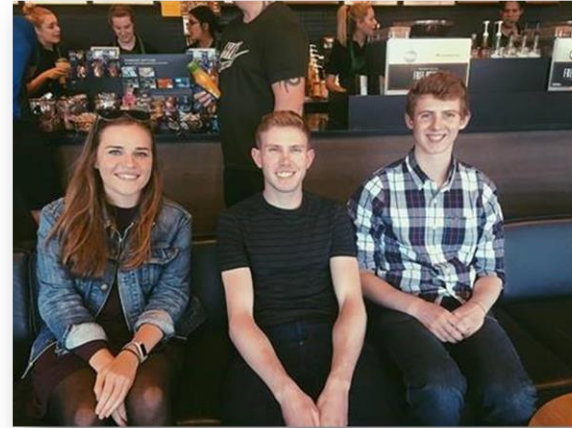
Our admissions requirements

- Minimum academic requirement is six GCSEs grades 9 – 5, including at least three 6 grades or equivalent.
- Candidates will normally have at least grade 6 in subjects to be studied to A-level, but it is necessary to have at least a grade 7 in:
 - Mathematics
 - Latin
 - Modern Foreign Languages
 - Sciences
- Check each subject for specific requirements



Getting our students where they want to go

- 91% into first choice university, 9% second choice
- Destinations this year included Oxford, Durham, Bristol, Imperial College, Loughborough and Warwick
- Courses included Law, English, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, Architecture and Electronic Engineering
- Degree Apprenticeships with Rolls Royce and KPMG
- Support through the Old Princethorpians network for university and beyond





Choosing your subjects

- Princethorpe College students study three A-levels (occasionally four) with an EPQ in Lower Sixth
- Choose your three subjects carefully
- Base your choices on:
 - Your **enjoyment** of and interest in particular areas (enjoyment = motivation = success)
 - Your **GCSE performance** in any relevant courses (note GCSE requirements for some A-levels)
 - Your **future education and career plans** (a few degrees require specific A-levels)
 - **Research** into the content of the courses this evening
