How to use Unifrog throughout the year to plan your future...

DATE/MONTH	WHAT SHOULD I BE DOING?
9 November 2017	<p>Attend the introduction to Unifrog Life Skills session with Mrs Quinney, Head of Careers and John Hillis from Unifrog.</p> <p>Register for your account You will need to log onto www.unifrog.org/code and register with your form code, name, details and a password</p>
17 November 2017 or before	<p>Fill in your "Post 16 intentions" It doesn't need to be fixed in concrete! We are just interested in where you want to go and if you have any plans at the moment.</p>
24 November 2017	<p>Record any activities you have done Make sure to log any academic activities including independent work and research projects as well as extracurricular projects. Also think outside of your studies such as work experience, volunteering or being part of a club/society.</p>
1 December 2017	<p>Start to complete your Competencies Make sure you expand on your activities by starting to log any competencies you have done in the past three weeks. Competencies can be used to build your Personal Statements for any applications you may make in the future.</p>
By the end of term (19 December 2017)	<p>Post-16 plans You should have decided which is your primary plan for after Year 11 and recorded this on Unifrog.</p> <p>Do you want to go to University in the future? Start creating shortlists in subject you are curious about studying to see what A-levels you will need.</p>
January 2018	<p>A-levels and University: Use Unifrog to look at Universities and how your GCSEs will impact your higher education options. Do courses require certain GCSE attainment? Are particular courses looking for specific subjects at A-level or equivalent? Have you considered the facilitating subjects?</p>
January – March 2018	<p>Keep adding to your competencies - What activities have you to support your competencies?</p>
